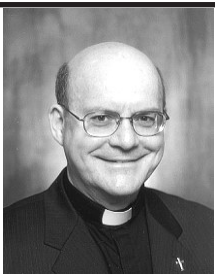

Dear Friends,

Blessings on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord!!!

It happened in those days
that Jesus came from
Nazareth of Galilee
and was baptized in the Jordan
by John.

- Mark 1:7-11

Jesus humbled himself to be baptized by John. The Word of God had humbled himself to be born into our human condition, born in a stable, laid in a manger. He humbled himself to be baptized by John and identified himself with sinners. He would humble himself, too, when he died on the cross (see Philippians 2:8).

Coinciding with Jesus' Baptism by John is his spiritual experience of seeing the heavens open, the descent of the Holy Spirit, and hearing the voice of the Father affirming his love for him as his Son and his pleasure with him (Mark 1:10-11).

We are witness to both the humility and the expression of affirmation. The relationship between the Father and the Son is revealed for our benefit in this stirring passage of Scripture.

He is the incredible source of our Baptism. We can remind ourselves of our Baptism daily with each Sign of the Cross we make. Our Baptism is renewed in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Thinking this way about that sacrament might help us to better understand and appreciate the continuing work of our repentance and God's forgiveness in our lives in Reconciliation, our relationship with God and the Church which has been weakened or destroyed by sin, is renewed or reclaimed. We are strengthened and validated in our faith.

The Christmas Season ends Sunday evening. Monday begins Ordinary Time.

Anointing of the Sick is available for anyone in our parishes who require this Sacrament. Please try to arrange for a time while the person is still alert and coherent. Avoid waiting until the last moments of life. What used to be called "The Last Rites" was not meant to be a last minute slide into home plate while taking one's last breath. Such thinking still has people afraid to ask for the Sacrament of Anointing and the Prayers for the Dying, which are and can be two separate things. Anytime someone is seriously ill is a time to ask for the Sacrament. Don't be bashful. God wants us to be healthy.

Let us count our blessings in this new year of grace.
