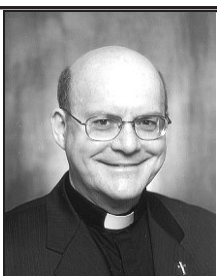

Happy Ordinary Time!

Jesus... said to them,

“What are you looking for?”

They said to him..., “Rabbi,

“Where are you staying?”

- John 1:38

Where is Jesus staying?

Do we want to follow him closely enough to find out? Will we like staying where he stays?

I keep reminding myself that in Ordinary Time we count the Sundays off with the ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, etc.) between the major seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter.

The *Ordo* [*Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and the Celebration of the Eucharist 2021 – Year B, Cycle I*; Compiled by Rev Peter D Rocca, CSC and published by Paulist Press, Book 12, © 2020] states:

“Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays.

This period is known as Ordinary Time.” Universal Norms, 43 [*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*]).

I think this helps explain Ordinary Time a little better.
