Happy Ordinary Time!

Ordinary Time (in which we count off the Sundays with the "ordinal" numbers, first, second, third, etc.) began on Monday. So, this Sunday is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, is a time in which the gospels teach us about the life of Jesus. Today our gospel is from John, not from Matthew, as we would expect. The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green.

John the Baptist testifies that Jesus is the "Son of God" (in John 1:34), after witnessing to the fact that he (John the Baptist) saw the Holy Spirit descend on Jesus. Last week we celebrated the final day of the Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In today's gospel we reflect on baptism and focus on the Holy Spirit. Is the Holy Spirit with us? Do we pray to the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit acted in Jesus; do we allow the Holy Spirit to act in us? Can you think of any more ways in which we can interact with the Holy Spirit?

At St. Patrick Parish, now through February, music will be provided on alternate Sundays by Gina Love and Therese Rose. Our gratitude to God and these two musicians will be heard in our singing! Thank you, Gina & Therese. Thank you, Lord.


