
Church Overseas Combined Collection

Monday is the patronal feast of St. Paul Parish. We will celebrate with prayerful remembrance at Mass on Sunday. Deacon Larry will be preaching at all the Masses in English this weekend. Thank you, Deacon, Larry Pasko.

For the world in its present form is passing away. – 1 Corinthians 7:31

Doesn't it seem like that is happening at a faster rate now than in the past? Maybe it can help us think of Jesus' words in the gospel: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15)

In contrast to the world passing away, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." (Hebrews 13:8) Repentance and belief are the ways we transition from the world which is passing away to the security of Jesus Christ – our rock foundation. As of Sunday, Lent is 25 days away. During our second Lent of the Coronavirus we may have a better understanding of how to adjust our lives in a world that isn't the same as the one we used to know.

Let us ask St. Paul, our Patron, whose conversion was miraculous, to pray for us to have the grace we need to cooperate with God in the building of his Church as St. Paul did. Let us learn to love Jesus the way St. Paul did.

Mass for Life 2020

Each year in January we recall the infamous Supreme Court decision Roe v. Wade that effectively legalized abortion on demand throughout the United States. Our diocese hosts A Mass for Life as a prayerful reminder that we "must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence."

Saturday, January 30, at 10:00 am at St. Columba Cathedral, Youngstown (154 W. Wood St.).

Each Mass for Life will include a Blessing of Children in the Womb. All are welcome – no reservations needed.

As I write this early on Tuesday morning, I know that our new President Joseph Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris will have been installed. We will have celebrated the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and we will be in the midst of the Nine Days for Life Novena.

But what else will be different that we did not plan for? How many more Covid-19 infections will there be? How many more deaths? Will there be any more new strains of the virus? What will be the impact? How well will the vaccinations be going?

We will surely be praying for the people of St. Patrick Parish in Hubbard after their fire in the basement of the church. They suffered a lot of smoke damage.

We will surely be praying for all the people who have been asking us to pray for them and their various intentions. We may even be spending time listening for God to speak to us, as last week's Scriptures encouraged us to do. We may be reaching out to help others with their needs.
