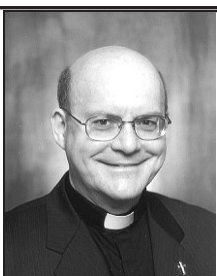

Catholic Schools Week

Salem & Leetonia, OH – January 31, 2021



Dear Friends,

[Moses spoke to all the people saying:] “A prophet like me will the Lord, your God, raise up from among your own kin; to him you shall listen.

- Deuteronomy 18:15

In the gospel, Christians see the prophecy of Moses fulfilled in Jesus. The descendants of the Israelites who came out of Egypt not only listened to Jesus, but also witnessed his deeds. And they were amazed.

Do we find ourselves amazed at what Jesus did then? Do we find ourselves amazed at what Jesus does now?

Repentance and growing in faith help us have a closer relationship with Jesus Christ who is *himself* the gospel, the “Good News.” He is the prophet who has been raised up because he is the Word of God now made flesh.

During this **Year of St. Joseph**, we Catholics may receive a plenary indulgence by performing prayers and spiritual works. The indulgences always require the Sacrament of Confession, receiving Holy Communion, and praying for the intentions of the Pope. The plenary indulgence is granted to those who perform the following works quoted from **Vatican News**: (<https://www.vaticannews.va/en/vatican-city/news/2020-12/apostolic-penitentiary-plenary-indulgence-year-st-joseph.html>)

Meditate for 30 minutes on the Lord’s Prayer or participate in a retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph

Perform a Spiritual or Corporal Work of Mercy

Recite the Rosary among families or engaged couples

Entrust their daily activity to the protection of St. Joseph and all those who ask St. Joseph to intercede for those seeking work to find dignifying work

Pray the Litany of St. Joseph or another prayer to St. Joseph for the persecuted Church and for relief of Christians suffering all forms of persecution.

In addition to these, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence to the faithful who will recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, for example, “To you, O blessed Joseph” especially on “**19 March, on 1 May, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph ...on the 19th of each month and every Wednesday**, a day dedicated to the memory of the saint according to the Latin tradition.”

For the Sick – The gift of the plenary indulgence is also extended to the sick, the elderly, the dying and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave their homes.

They too can obtain the plenary indulgences if they are detached from any sin and have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions and recite an act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, offering to God the pains and hardships of their lives.

St. Joseph, pray for us.
