

**St. Paul School Foundation Awards
2020 Scholarships**

Congratulations to Colleen Bungard, Andrea “Annie” Fitch, Abigail “Abby” George, Zachary “Zach” Murray, Theodore “TJ” Pittman, Carolyn “Carly” Scarpitti, and Nicholas “Nick” Scarpitti! These 2014 St. Paul School graduates shared equally a total of \$14,000 in financial assistance for their first year of college education. Colleen will attend Otterbein University; Annie will enroll in Kent State; Abby plans to study at Youngstown State; Zach will study at the University of Akron; TJ will attend the Pittsburgh Institute of Aeronautics; Carly plans to enroll at the University of Dayton; and Nick will attend the University of Dayton or Purdue University.

High school seniors who graduated from St. Paul School are eligible for the scholarship. Awards are based on grade point average, parish involvement, two letters of recommendation, and an essay that describes educational and career plans and the impact of a St. Paul School Catholic education on an applicant's academic achievement. The foundation is proud to help these alumni and encourages them to return often to St. Paul. Happy Pentecost! **Come Holy Spirit!**

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Pentecost. The Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus and awaited by the Church, is now manifested. The promise of the Father (Luke 24:49) comes to us. The Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks about the Holy Spirit in sections 683-747; sections 767 and 768 tell of how the Holy Spirit reveals the Church. Section 770, speaking on “The Mystery of the Church,” states:

The Church is in history, but at the same time she transcends it. It is only “with the eyes of faith” that one can see her in her visible reality and at the same time in her spiritual reality as bearer of divine life.

Today we ask that the Holy Spirit may give us the “eyes of faith” so that we may see all that we need to see about the spiritual reality of the Church of which we are members.
