Dear Friends,

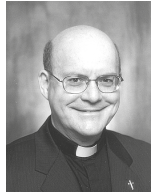
when things are in heaven, who can search them out?

The Canonization of Mother Teresa - September 4, 2016



One of the most beloved women of her time, Mother Teresa set out to serve the poorest of the poor for Christ. This September 4th, the Catholic Church will proclaim her a saint, and therefore worthy of imitation by the faithful.

The Albanian-born Mother Teresa joined the Sisters of Loretto at age 17 & was sent to Calcutta, India. While recuperating from an illness, she received what she called “an order” from God to leave her convent & live among the poor.

In 1950, Mother Teresa founded the Missionaries of Charity as a congregation of the Diocese of Calcutta. She died Sept. 5, 1997 at the age of 87. She was beatified 6 years later by St. John Paul II, Oct. 19, 2003.

The Canonization of Mother Teresa will be aired on Sept. 4th at 12:00 Noon on the Catholic television network, CTNY-ETC.
