April 13, regular Mass schedules

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

We receive palm fronds to participate in this re-enactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes and palm branches in front of him as a sign of homage – a customary practice to show great respect.

During our Mass today, we distribute blessed palms to everyone to carry them in a ritual procession into church. Many people will fashion the palms into small crosses or other items of personal devotion, which are kept for the year.

Because the palms are blessed, they must not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately returned to the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the following year's Ash Wednesday observance.

Holy Triduum Catechesis

With the solemn celebration of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, we enter three holy days, a Sacred Triduum, that ends on Easter Sunday night. In these sacred Three Days, the core mysteries of our faith come alive for us. We remember with great fervor and intensity the saving passion, death and resurrection of Christ. We find ourselves at the Last Supper, at the Cross, and at the empty tomb - not in a historical re-enactment, but in a way that cuts through time and space and places us in the presence of the Savior. We celebrate these days with great dedication and devotion because these days are about life and death. Not just Jesus' life and death, but our life and death and our Passover with him to the Father. By spiritually celebrating these sacred days together, we hope to be drawn more deeply into the mystery of Christ, so that all Jesus did to save us will become a life-giving spring within us. These days make us who we are as Catholics. Our participation in the Sacred Triduum not only benefits our individual spiritual journey, but nurtures the well-being of the Body of Christ - the community of faith called to be Christ in the world.

HOLY THURSDAY ###, April 17

Mass of the Lord's Supper at 6:00pm at St. Paul

with Eucharistic Vigil until 10:00pm in the Rectory meeting room

We begin our celebration of the *Triduum* with the <u>Mass of the Lord's Supper</u> on Holy Thursday. In the first reading from the Book of Exodus, we hear the ancient story of the Jewish Passover. The Passover, Israel's deliverance and the covenant God initiated, will become the lens through which we can understand our whole observance of the *Triduum*. The Mass we offer on this night is celebrated with heightened solemnity, for on this night we remember the institution of the Eucharist and the office of the Priesthood at the Last Supper. To understand the full meaning of the Eucharist on this night, we must peer through the lens of the

ancient Passover and Jesus' self-emptying act of love when he washed his disciples' feet. To participate in the Eucharist is to participate in the sacrifice of Christ, offering ourselves with Christ to the Father. Recall the words of Jesus when he addressed his disciples: "Can you drink of the cup of which I am to drink?" To partake of this Holy Supper is to share in Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. In receiving the Eucharist sacramentally on this night, we invite our parish family to encounter Jesus spiritually in their heart by joining us in prayer. The liturgy this night has no formal ending, for the *Three Days* are really one celebration.

* * Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord * *

April 18, Celebration of the Lord's Passion

at 3:00pm at St. Paul, and 6:00pm at St. Patrick

Today, we gather as a community to solemnly commemorate the passion and death of our Lord. We begin in silence and listen to the Scriptures that focus on Christ, the suffering Servant of God. In the Passion according to John, we re-live the final hours of Jesus' life. His painful death on the cross is the climax of a life of obedient service to the Kingdom of God. Jesus is the "new Adam", who by his faithfulness has reconciled humanity's relationship with God, broken by our first parents' disobedience. Throughout the liturgy there is a sense of glory, for we see in the cross today the light of our deliverance shining through the agonizing way of the cross. In what is one of the most ancient forms of the Prayers of the Faithful we will pray for the needs of our church and our world, trusting that the redemptive love of Christ can transform all things. The liturgy on Good Friday reaches a high point as the congregation venerates the cross in whatever manner they desire. It is an opportunity to personally connect our individual crosses with the cross of Jesus, to redefine the meaning of our own suffering in the light of his passion. After sharing in Communion consecrated at last night's Mass (since there are no Masses celebrated anywhere in the world today), we take our leave in silence to await the great Vigil - for the passion of Jesus and the crucifixion he endured is not the entire story of our redemption. The Mystery of our salvation is fulfilled with the resurrection of Christ.

Throughout the world on **Holy Saturday**, there are no Masses celebrated during the day. It is a day of keeping vigil, of pondering the mystery of Christ's life, passion, and death, and waiting to hear the good news of Easter. It is only as evening falls at 8:30pm that our Church gathers in darkness for **the solemn Easter Vigil**.

This is the story of our faith, our Christian heritage, our past and our future. We sing Alleluia again and proclaim the Easter Gospel. We renew our baptismal vows. We see ourselves anew as God's holy people, the Church. We celebrate the first Eucharist of Easter and we affirm the Church not as a cult of a dead man, but of faithful disciples of the living Christ, who this night shares with us his Body and Blood. Like the disciples at Emmaus, we discover the Risen Christ in the breaking of the bread. We find ourselves seated at heaven's table, a foretaste of what awaits us in the life to come.

Circumstances can change in an instant. Our "secure" position at work can be eliminated. One blood test at a routine physical can reveal an unexpected illness. A unexpected storm can take the roof off our home. Jesus knew this. He entered Jerusalem to great fanfare on Palm Sunday. Huge crowds gathered to welcome Him, waving palm fronds, calling, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, [even] the king of Israel" (John 12:13). Just days later, Jesus would celebrate the Last Supper with His apostles before spending an agonizing night of prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane where He was betrayed and abandoned. Five days later, He'd die a torturous death alongside criminals.

When a reversal in fortune rattles us, we can remind ourselves that Jesus understands our anxiety. He is there for us; we can rely on Him and draw strength from His peace. And if we are experiencing a period of calm and plenty, we can help those whose circumstances are not so blessed through a gift to the Annual Diocesan Appeal.
